Transfers

Jump Height Order

Obedience classes with jumps will be run small to tall both days starting with 4".

Rally classes with jumps will be run small to tall starting with 4".

Entry Fees

Fees are for each dog, for each individual trial.

First obedience or rally class entry\$30.00

Each additional obedience or rally entry\$20.00

Obedience entry fees include \$0.50 AKC Recording Fee and \$3.00 Service Fee.

Rally entry fees include a Recording Fee of \$3.50 for each rally entry.

A waitlist will be maintained in accordance with the Obedience Regulations Ch. 1, Sec. 27 in order to fill openings created by withdrawals before closing.

Multiple events on the same day are separate trials.

Each event requires a first-entry fee of \$30.

All entries must be submitted on official AKC entry forms, one dog per entry form.

Photocopies of entry forms without the AKC Agreement are not acceptable.

Unsigned, incomplete, or illegible entries are not acceptable.

If you would like confirmation that your entry was received before the trial has closed, please include your email address or enclose a self-addressed stamped postcard.

Entries cannot be changed once the trial has closed.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs six (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or are approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds.

Dogs with a PAL/ILP number or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf, bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect a dog's physical or mental performance are not eligible to compete. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Rules Applying to Registration and Discipline for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate.

Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations, it includes both sexes.

Notice to Exhibitors

The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering these trials, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all exercises safely.

Entry fees will not be refunded if the trials cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the Event Committee.

Since **bitches in season** are not allowed to compete in AKC Obedience or Rally Trials, the club will refund all but \$5 per entry for bitches unable to compete for that reason. The Trial Secretary must receive written notification from a veterinarian of such a claim for refund by letter hand-delivered, emailed, or postmarked 30 minutes before the trial commences.

No refunds other than bitches in season will be offered.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

Exhibitors are responsible for being ready for judging when called to the ring. The judge need not wait for any dog holding up a class. The Show-Giving Club and Show Secretary have no obligation or responsibility for providing service through a public address system, or stewards or runners for the purpose of locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Entries must be made on Official AKC entry forms or copies and must include the signed Agreement and Rules. Junior Handlers must complete back of form.

All owners of mixed breed dogs must first obtain an AKC Canine Partners listing number before they may enter an AKC event. The dog's breed name should be entered as "All American Dog". The dog's listing number must be entered on the entry form and "AKC No." checked.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites and any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may have made such errors. No entry will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Errors in entries made by the exhibitor cannot be corrected after the closing date.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There is a \$25 returned check fee.

All dogs must be on leash or crated at all times except when in the ring. Warm-up must be done on lead.

Dogs under 6 months of age are not permitted on the show grounds of AKC events.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s) at the show site and at all hotels, motels, and campgrounds where they are staying while competing in these trials.

Per AKC Obedience Regulations Chapter 2, Section 17:

All dogs in the obedience ring must wear a properly fitted collar approved by the judge. No dog may enter the ring, either for judging or for awards, with unacceptable equipment. No special training collars, such as electronic collars or prong collars, will be permitted. Nothing may be hanging from the dog's collar.

In the event of a judging change occurring after the date of closing, exhibitors may withdraw from the classes affected by the judging change upon written notification received by the Trial Secretary 30 minutes before the scheduled start of that trial. A \$5.00 administrative fee will be assessed for each entry withdrawn.

The building will be open at 7:00 a.m. each day for exhibitors.

Trial hours are 8:00 am – 5:00 pm CST.

No smoking is allowed in the building.

PRE-ORDER CATALOGS. Catalogs may be pre-ordered for \$5.00 per catalog. Check the catalog box on the entry form and include \$5.00 per with your entry fees. A limited number of catalogs will be available for purchase at the trial for \$5.00 per catalog.

CRATING. Limited crating available in the building.

PARKING: There is no parking on the INSIDE curve of Haase Road.

FOOD: No food or beverages will be available on site.

CELL PHONES: Please make sure to turn your cell phones to silent mode when you are in the building

AKC® Code of Sportsmanship and Civility

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs. These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years. Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
 - Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
 - Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
 - Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
 - Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
 - Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
 - Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
 - Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
 - Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
 - Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
 - Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect,
- regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
 - Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
 - Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
 - The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
 - The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
 - The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
 - The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
 - Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
 - Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
 - Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.

INSTRUCTIONS

- (Variety) if you are entering a dog of breed in which there are varieties for show purposes, please designate the particular variety you are entering, i.e., Cocker Spaniel (solid color black, ASCOB, parti-color), Beagles (not exceeding 13 in., over 13 in. but not exceeding 15 in.), Dachshunds (longhaired, smooth, wirehaired), Collies (rough, smooth), Bull Terriers (colored, white), Manchester Terriers (standard, toy), Chihuahuas (smooth coat, long coat), English Toy Spaniels (King Charles and Ruby, Blenheim and Prince Charles), Poodles (toy, miniature, standard).
- (Event Class) Consult the classification in this premium list. If the event class in which you are entering your dog is divided, then, in addition to designating the class, specify the particular division of the class in which you are entering your dog, i.e. A or B division.
- A dog must be entered in the name of the person who actually owned it at the time entries for an event closed. If a registered dog has been acquired by a new owner it must be entered in the name of its new owner in any event for which entries closed after the date of acquirement, regardless of whether the new owner has received the registration certificate indicating that the dog is recorded in his/her name. State on entry form whether transfer application has been mailed to the AKC. (For complete rules, refer to Chapter 11, Section 3.)
- Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine PartnersSM** Program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC Obedience trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC Number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box. Sire and Dam information shall remain blank for mixed breed entrants.

AGREEMENT

I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE:

There is no parking on the INSIDE curve of Haase Road.

From North (Fond du Lac/Green Bay): Take Hwy 151 to I90/94 (north of Madison). Go west (north) on I90/94 to Hwy 51 South, exit #132.

From West (Wisconsin Dells): Take I-90/94 toward Madison. Exit at Hwy 51 South, exit #132.

From South (Janesville), take I-90 north toward Madison. Exit at Hwy 51 South, exit #132.

From East (Milwaukee): Take I-94 to I-39/ I-90 West toward Wisconsin Dells. Exit at Hwy 51 South, exit #132.

From Hwy 51 South Exit: Go south on Hwy 51 to stoplight at water tower (CTH CV/Anderson Road) and turn left. Turn left on Haase Rd. then take the fifth (5th) driveway on the right-hand side on Haase Rd. The BKC Training Center is located on the north side of the parking lot.

(For those coming North on Hwy 51 from Madison - Be sure you are on Anderson Road, not Anderson Street.)
