Refunds: No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. However, the club reserves the right to alter this policy due to current events. If the trial is cancelled due to public health guidelines, you will receive a full refund.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in Scentwork Trials. As such, the club will issue a full refund minus \$10.00 processing fee per day for bitches unable to compete for this reason, if a veterinarian's certificate is presented to the Trial Secretary 30 minutes prior to the start of judging.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club.

Due to the nature of the trial, dogs may only enter at their current level of competition or one below. For example, a Detective dog can enter Master but not Excellent. A Master dog that has not trialed in Detective and is not entering Detective could enter Master and Excellent. An Excellent dog could also enter Advanced, an Advanced dog could also enter Novice B.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind can participate so long as the handler has control of the dog, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and search area sizes will be as stated in the AKC regulations for all elements and levels. Searches may be indoors on matted, carpeted or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete or asphalt surfaces. Trial will take place rain or shine.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Rosettes will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place – Blue, Second Place – Red, Third Place – Yellow, Fourth Place – White

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). The staging area will include warm-up and waiting areas.

One labeled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers in the warm-up area if they choose.

The Handler's Briefing will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class*, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing. *This may be modified per AKC Best Practices.

SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site: It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. This includes driving into the parking lot or otherwise disturbing their regular business. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future. This trial site will not be used for Scent training one week before the trial.

Possession of Odors and Training: Chapter 5, Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations states "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area."

Spectator Area: Spectators may be allowed.

Crating space: Crating space is available in the Great Hall and grooming area.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

A preliminary confirmation will be sent once your entry is received. A final confirmation with trial details will be sent out at the beginning of the week before the trial.

Handler Briefings – Handler's Briefing information will be detailed in the fnal confirmation email which will be sent during the week before the trial. The judge will also give each exhibitor a short briefing when you come to each search area.

Arrival times will be included in the final confirmation email. Set-ups are allowed at the site. Exhibitors are forbidden to discuss *any* details of the searches with handlers who have not run!

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR AND LIABILITY

The **safety of the dog** is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such a case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club (USA) ("the club") and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the club or any official thereof.

Collars, Harnesses and Leashes: During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge (tags ok). Dogs are permitted to have a wearable camera such as a Go Pro mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches where allowed). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed. Handlers will have the option to run Detective class off-leash.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. Details about flow and run order progression will be covered in the final confirmation.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.
